

When robbers were coming to the church, Saint Hyacinth took Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and a statue of Mary to a place that was safe.

He did this to show his love and reverence for Jesus and Mary.

DISCUSSION:

How do we show we have reverence for God?

REVERENCE: showing your deepest respect for things of God

HOME PROJECT: Due October _____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our minds and our hearts to listen to God's Word. (Read and discuss Exodus 3:1-5.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Practice making the *Sign of the Cross* with reverence.



“In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.”

This is a powerful prayer that means we dedicate what we are doing in honor of the Trinity.

Practice genuflecting with reverence. We kneel on our right knee and make the *Sign of the Cross* facing Jesus in the tabernacle whenever we go in or out of church, to say “hello” to Jesus and to kneel to Him to show that He is our King.

REVERENCE: showing your deepest respect for things of God

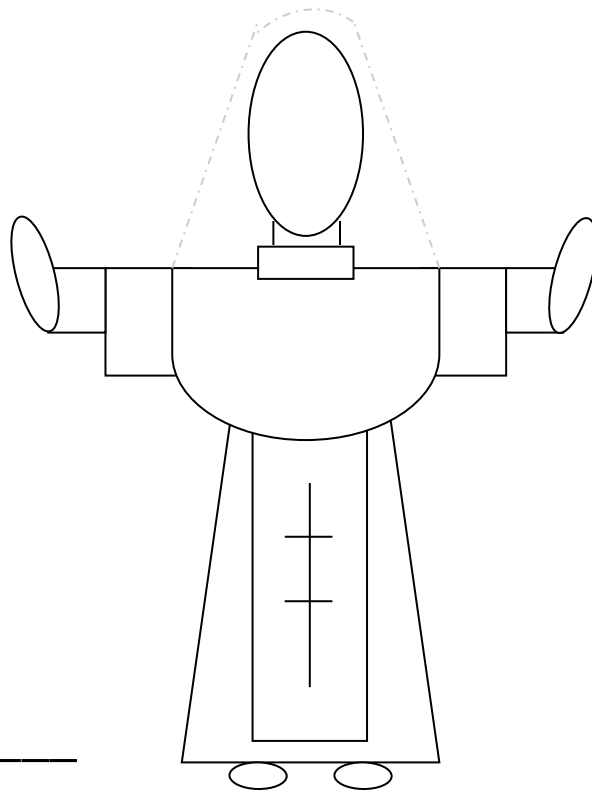
PRAYER:

HOME PROJECT: Due November_____



PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our minds and our hearts to God's Word. (Read Genesis 1:27-31.)

Dear God, thank You for filling our world with such beautiful plants and animals! Help us to take care of all You have given us, and to give You the very best. Amen.

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

1. Discuss the words of the *Grace Before Meals* prayer and the first line of the *Morning Offering*.
2. Practice a concrete example of giving God your first fruits. Ask each student to bring in a few matching pieces of fruit: a bunch of grapes, a bunch of bananas, a small bag of apples or oranges. In class, find the very best one from each set. Put these in a basket and give them to God by giving them to someone in need or someone consecrated to God. Take the rest home.
3. Ask each student to bring in a quarter. Visit church together and put your coins in the poor box.

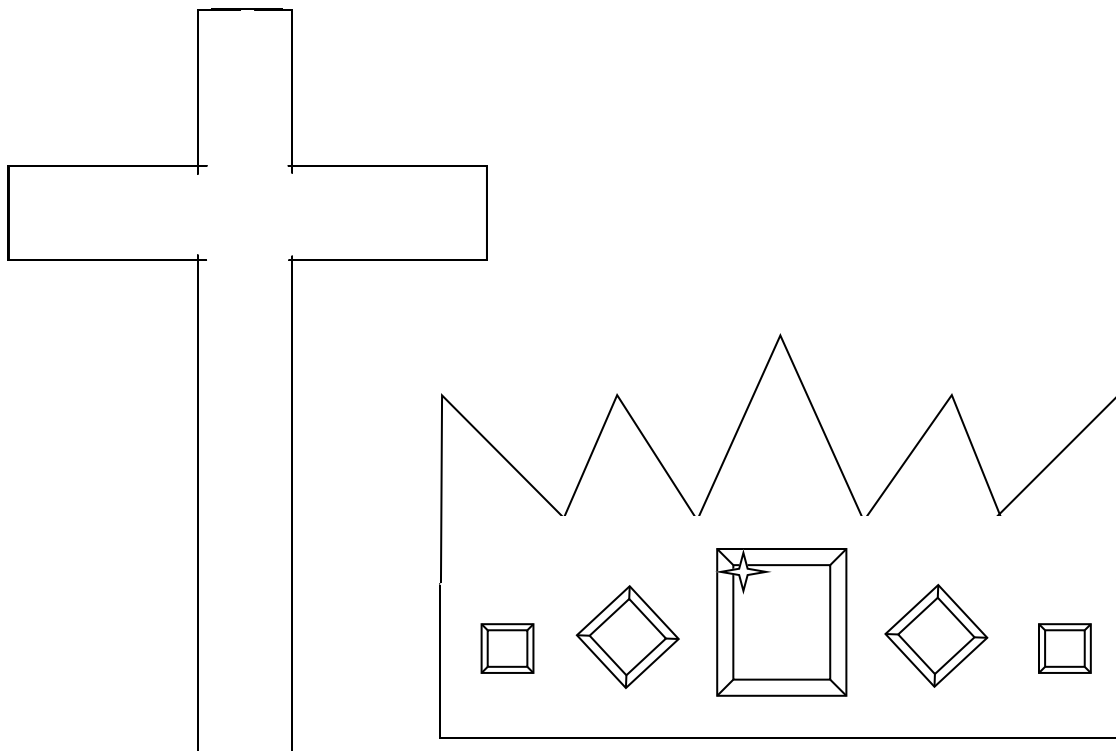
STEWARDSHIP: returning to God the first fruits of your time, talent, and treasure



- Does your church or school have a celebration in honor of Saint Nicholas? What is it like?

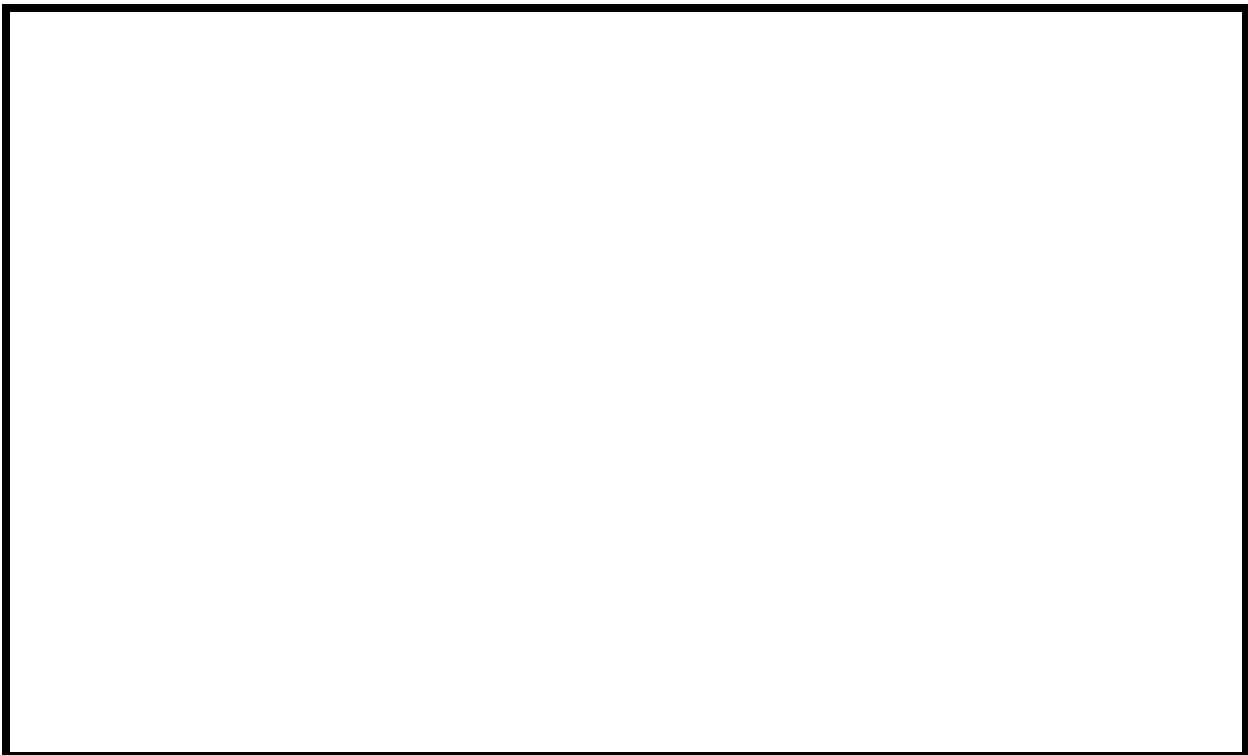

(1181-1226, Italy)

Feast: October 4

Saint Francis gave away all his riches to be more like Jesus. He loved to thank God for plants, animals, and all of creation.

DISCUSSION:

Name gifts in God's creation for which you are thankful.

GRATITUDE: seeing everything as a gift and being thankful

HOME PROJECT: Due January ____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our hearts and minds to listen to God's Word. (Read and discuss Colossians 3:17.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Role play these situations. Practice saying thank you to the person *and* thank you to God. (Sometimes we thank God out loud and sometimes we thank God in our heart. You can choose.)

1. Your mom cooks dinner for you.
2. Your teacher takes you outside for extra recess.
3. A classmate shares a toy with you.
4. Your brother or sister helps you to practice the alphabet.
5. God makes a beautiful sunset.
6. Your dad drives you to school.
7. Your friend gives you a compliment.

PRAYER:

Saint Francis, you thanked God for everything He has made. Help us to be grateful like you! Thank you, God, for _____. Amen. Saint Francis of Assisi, pray for us!

SAINT ACTIVITY:

These people told the children to change their story or they would get in trouble,

but the children did not give up, because they were telling the truth.

HONESTY: being trustworthy and true

DISCUSSION:


What gave the children the strength to be honest?

HOME PROJECT: Due February ____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our minds and our hearts to God's Word. (Read and discuss Deuteronomy 5:1, 20.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Lies are never okay, but we also do not have to  say everything that is true. Whenever you are not sure if you should say something, ask yourself these three questions: Is it true? Is it kind? Is it helpful?

Role play being honest in these situations:

1. Your mom asks you if your room is clean.
2. Your brother asks, "Who broke my toy?"
3. Your friend says, "We are not allowed to take these cookies, so just don't tell."
4. Your teacher sends home a note to tell your parents you got in trouble that day.
5. Your friend asks, "Do you like my new game?"
But you actually don't like it!

HONESTY: being trustworthy and true

PRAYER:

Saint Francesco and Jacinta, help us to be honest and brave like you! Help us to tell the truth, even when it is hard. Amen. Saint Francesco and Saint Jacinta, pray for us.

SAINT ACTIVITY:

Close your eyes and imagine Our Blessed Mother, Mary. In a quiet corner, take turns telling your teacher or classroom helper what you think Mary looks like and what she would say to you. Ask them to write your answers here:

What do you think Mary looks like?

What would she say to you?

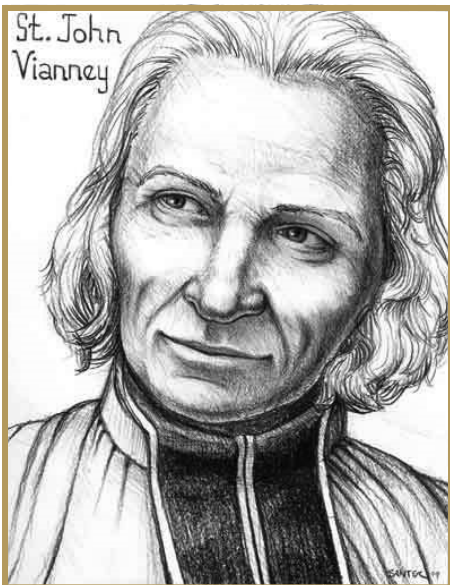

Feast: August 4

Saint John Vianney spent hours and hours hearing peoples' Confessions so they could receive the mercy of Jesus and be happy.

DISCUSSION:

What are some ways we can show mercy?

MERCY: caring for those who suffer

HOME PROJECT: Due March _____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our hearts and our minds to God's Word! (Read and discuss Matthew 5:1-2, 7.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Read the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). Choose students to act out the different parts. Read it again slowly so that they can do the actions as the story is read.

Discuss:

1. Which character in the story does Jesus want us to imitate?
2. Why should we care for those who suffer?

PRAYER:

Saint John Vianney, you were very gentle and spent many hours caring for souls who were suffering by giving them God's mercy. Help us to be loving toward those who are hurting in their body or in their heart. Amen. Saint John Vianney, pray for us!

SAINT ACTIVITY:

Make a thank you card for a priest you know. A priest stands in the place of Jesus in a special way, so make your card very beautiful!

Write these words on the card:

Thank you, Father, for showing us God's mercy!

PRAYER:

Mother Mary, you followed your Son, Jesus when He carried His cross. Help us to be loving toward those who need it most. (Pray 3 *Hail Marys*.)

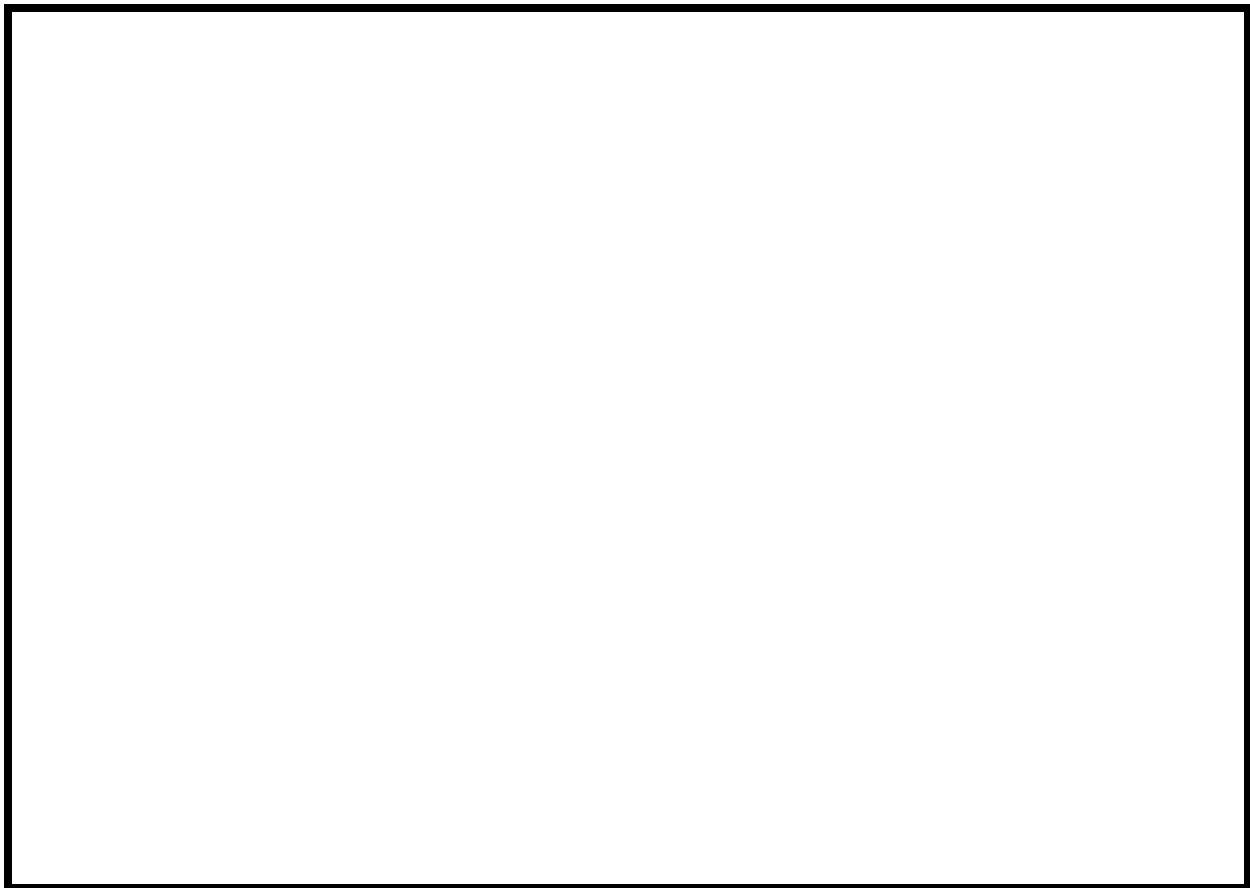

SAINT OF THE MONTH:

St. Anthony of Padua,

Saint Anthony of Padua

(1195-1231, Italy)

Feast: June 13

Saint Anthony was a priest who loved Jesus and the poor very much. When someone took a book that did not belong to him, Saint Anthony prayed, and the thief brought it back. Today, people ask Saint Anthony to pray and help them find things that are lost!

JUSTICE: being fair and giving each his due

DISCUSSION:

What should you do if you see someone take something that belonged to someone else?

HOME PROJECT: Due April _____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our hearts and our minds to listen to God's Word. (Read and discuss Psalm 37:28.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Make a "Justice Chart" to keep in your classroom:

1. Take a blank piece of paper and put your name at the top.
2. Make two columns; at the top of the first, write "Take turns," at the top of the second write "Sharing".
3. At the end of each day, make one mark in each column for each time you did these things.



PRAYER:

Saint Anthony, help us to be fair, to take turns and to share. And help us to find things that are lost! Amen. Saint Anthony, pray for us.

SAINT ACTIVITY:

Saint Anthony is the patron saint of lost articles. In his honor, play "Lost and Found."

1. Ask for 3 volunteer seekers.
2. Tell the seekers to choose a simple item from their cubbies/desks, and hand it in to the teacher.
3. Ask the seekers to leave the room for a moment. (Someone might want to go with them, to make sure they don't peek!)
4. Without any noise, show the teacher your ideas about where to hide each item in the classroom.
5. Let the seekers in the room. Tell them that if they get tired of looking for their hidden item, they can say, "Saint Anthony, help me!" and the teacher will give them a clue.

Mother Mary, help us to be fair so that we can make Your Son Jesus happy. (Pray 3 *Hail Marys*.)

Zeal: loving God so much that it gives you energy

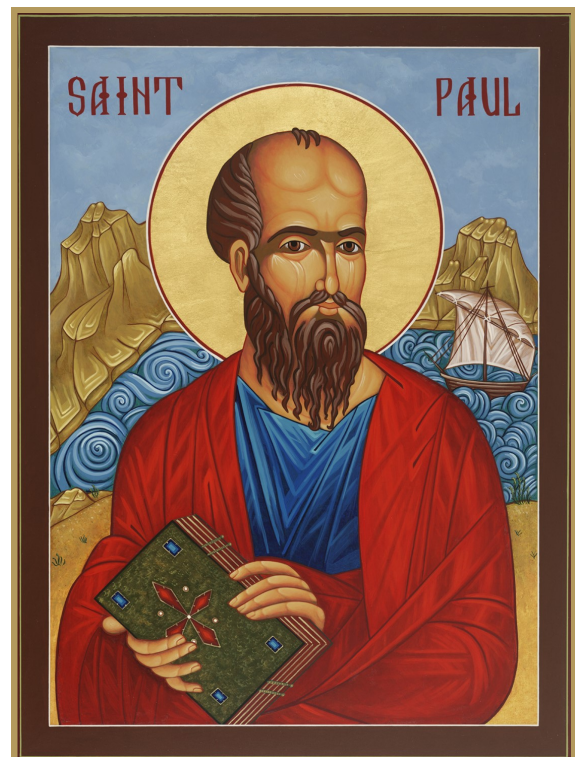
SAINT OF THE MONTH:

(3-65 AD, Turkey)

Feasts: January 25 and
June 29

Saint Paul loved God so much that he traveled to many countries to tell people about Jesus. He wrote letters to tell people about God's love. We can read these letters in the Bible.

DISCUSSION:

What can you do to show God that you love Him very much?

HOME PROJECT: Due May _____

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, open our minds and our hearts to God's Word. (Read and discuss 1 Corinthians 9:24-25.)

VIRTUE ACTIVITY:

Do one of these things *each day* to help your zeal for God grow:



1. If you have the chance to go to Mass, sing the hymns with your best voice, all the way to the end.
2. Tell one person today that God loves them.
3. Pick one special prayer intention and then pray for it three times—in the morning, at noon, and at night.
4. Learn one new thing about God that you can share with someone else.

ZEAL: being driven by an intense love for God

PRAYER:

Saint Paul, you loved God so much that you walked for days and weeks to cities far away to tell them about Jesus. When they tried to scare you to make you be quiet, you kept teaching! Help us to love Jesus with as much zeal as you did. Amen. Saint Paul, pray for us.

SAINT ACTIVITY:

Read the story of the conversion of Saint Paul in Acts 9:1-22. After hearing the story, act it out!

1. Saul is on his way to arrest the Christians.
2. Saul hears a voice saying, "Why are you persecuting me?" He asks, "Who are you?" and the voice says, "I am Jesus, who you are persecuting."
3. Saul goes blind and people lead him by the hand.
4. God tells Ananias to heal Saul, and Ananias asks God, "Are you sure?"
5. Things like scales fall from Saul's eyes.
6. Saul begins to tell people that Jesus is the Messiah.

PRAYER:

Mother Mary, you love God so much that you will do anything for Him. Pray with us like you prayed with the Apostles at Pentecost, so that the Holy Spirit will set our hearts on fire with love for Jesus! (Pray 3 *Hail Marys*.)

The *Virtues in Practice* program was originally written by a team of parents and faculty members at St. Gertrude School in Cincinnati, Ohio in 2005, and implemented beginning with the 2006 academic year.
